Leicester 25<sup>th</sup> October 1779

Sir

In due attention to your respectable favor of the 13.<sup>th</sup> curr.<sup>t</sup> I furnished Capt<sup>n</sup> Thomas Smart with as many articles, as he thought suitable for the use of the army p. annexed invoice, which he desired me to forward to your Honor, together with a package of said goods; have therefore embraced the first safe conveyance and transmitted them p. Nathan Greene the bearer hereof, as p. his enclosed receipt, wishing he may deliver them in good order. For the amo.<sup>t</sup> of these goods Cap.<sup>t</sup> Smart has drawn three sets bills pay.<sup>a</sup> at 6, 10, & 15 days after sight, which, when presented, doubt not will meet with ready acceptance.
